









Year 5 and 6 Autumn 2 Homework

In Year 5 and 6, we expect the children to be completing the following activities daily, to support their learning: 15 minutes of reading, 15 minutes of time table practise (you could use TTRS) and 15 minutes of spelling practise (Spelling Shed).

We have been learning about the Migration in Geography and Lifecycles in Science so some optional homework this half term is based around developing your knowledge in this area, having fun, being creative and spending time with your families to create these. Try to complete as many as you can by the end of term. Bring in your projects to share with the class.

<p>Life Cycle Expert! – Choose an animal (e.g. frog, butterfly, bird, or mammal) and create a detailed diagram or model showing its life cycle. Label each stage clearly.</p> 	<p>From Caterpillar to Butterfly – Write a diary entry from the point of view of an animal going through a life cycle change — what does it feel like to transform?</p> 	<p>Migration Map – Research an animal that migrates (such as a whale, bird, or butterfly). Create a map showing its migration journey and the challenges it faces along the way.</p> 	<p>People on the Move – Interview a family member or friend about a time they or their ancestors moved home or country. Write up their story and include where and why they moved.</p> 
<p>Create a Habitat – Design and build a small habitat or model suitable for a stage of an animal's life cycle. For example, a pond for tadpoles or a nest for birds.</p> 	<p>Fact File Fun – Create a fact file about an endangered species whose life cycle or migration is being affected by climate change.</p> 	<p>Migration Poetry – Write a poem titled 'The Journey' inspired by animals or people who migrate. Try to include descriptive language and emotion.</p> 	<p>Artwork with a Message – Design a poster that teaches others about the importance of protecting habitats and supporting migrating species.</p>
